■ UK (UCAS) – FINAL Application Deadline

A reminder that **Wednesday**, **Jan. 31**st @ **18:00 GMT (19:00 CET)** is the closing date for applications. As the relevant counsellor is responsible for approving and sending the application to UCAS, all UK applicants should make sure they have completed the **'pay and send'** process by **16:00** on **Tuesday**, **Jan. 30**th to allow the counsellor enough time for a final review of the application.

CAO Ireland – FINAL Application Deadline

A reminder that **Thursday**, **Feb.** 1st @ 17:00 is the normal closing date for applications. Applicants should forward their '**Statement of Application**' with their course/institution choices to their counsellor and ensure that their <u>MaiaLearning</u> 'Applying' list is updated.

Junior Conferences will take place throughout the spring beginning in February and ending in June. German Higher Education Explained


